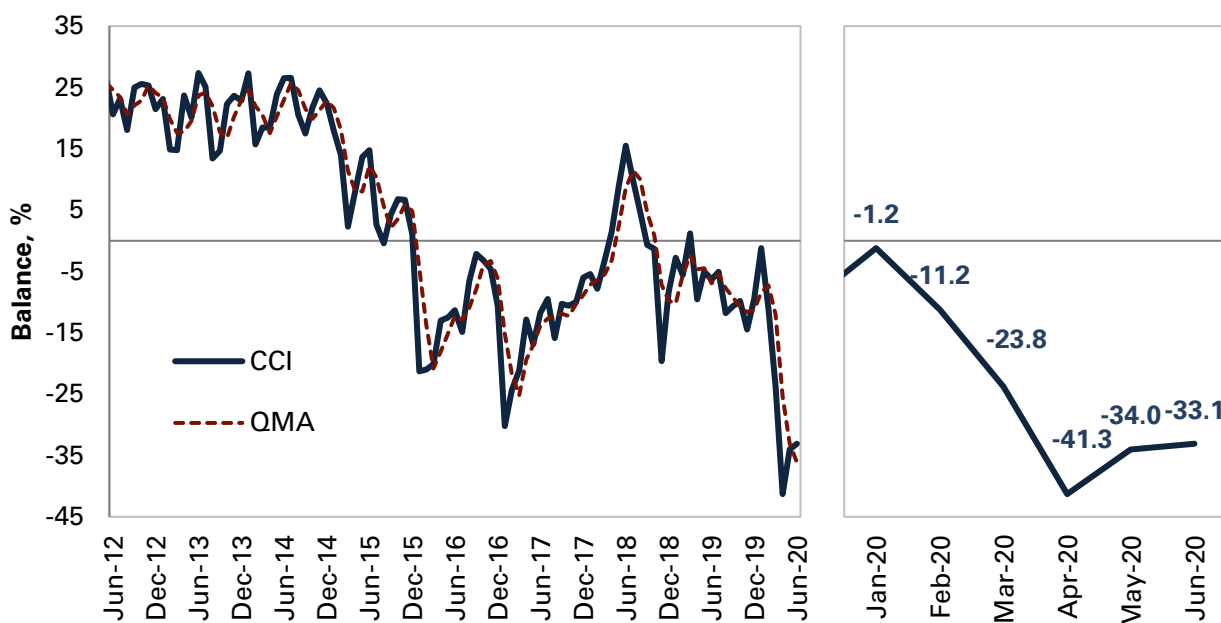


In June, the Consumer Confidence Index (CCI) recorded a balance of -33.1%. This represents an increase of 0.9 percentage points (pps) compared to the previous month. Compared to May 2020, the increase was due to a rise of 1.7 pps in the Consumer Expectations Index that made up for the fall of 0.2 pps in the Economic Conditions Index. Consumer confidence increased in the low and medium strata and two of the five analyzed cities compared to May 2020. Meanwhile, willingness to buy furniture and home appliances increased relative to the last month.

According to the results of the Consumer Opinion Survey (COS) of June, the Consumer Confidence Index (CCI) recorded a balance of -33.1%. This value represents an increase of 0.9 percentage points (pps) compared to the previous month.

The increase in consumer confidence compared to May 2020 was due to a rise in the Consumer Expectations Index that made up for the fall in the Economic Conditions Index.

The CCI has five components, the details of which are presented in Table 1. The first three refer to the expectations of households in a given year, while the other two refer to the perception of consumers regarding current economic situation. The Consumer Expectations Index (CEI) is constructed with the first three and the Economic Conditions Index (ECI) with the two remaining.

The increase of the CCI compared to May is explained by a increase of 1.7 pps in the Consumer Expectations Index (-12.7%) that made up for the fall of 0.2 pps in the Economic Conditions Index (-63.6%).

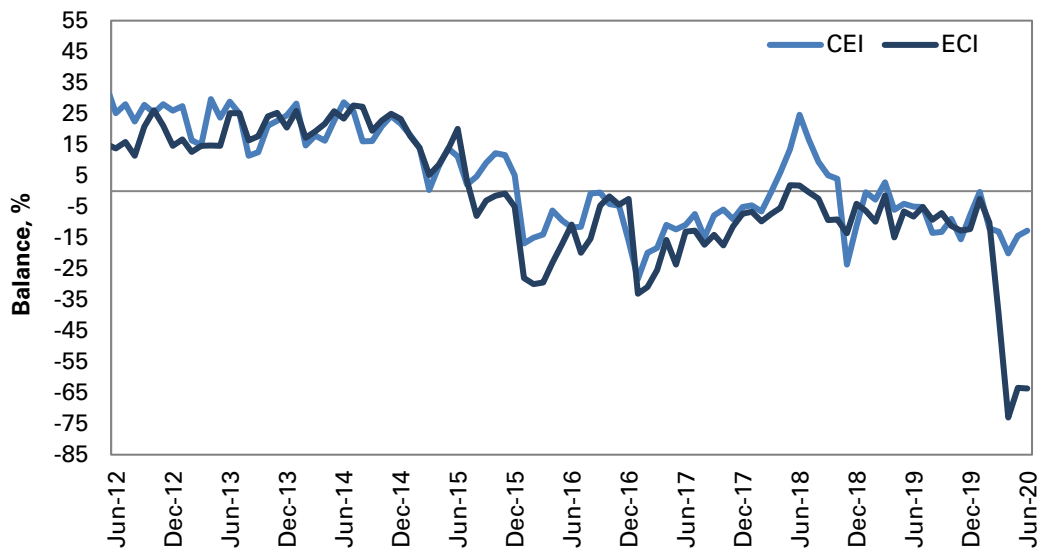

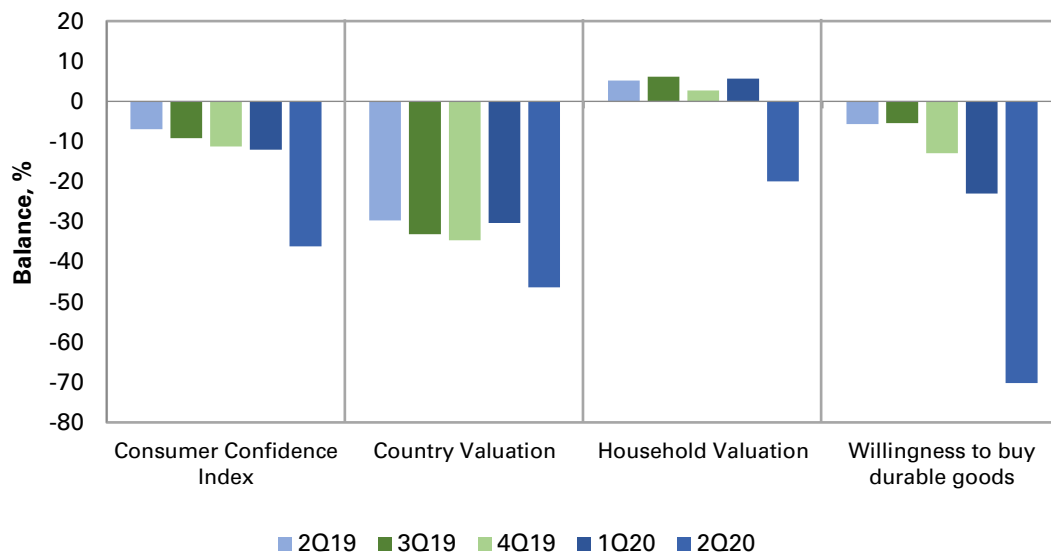
When comparing the results of the second quarter of 2020 with the observed average during the second quarter of 2019, consumer's assessment of their households' situation decreased 25.1 pps and the consumer's assessment of the country decreased 16.7 pps. On the other hand, consumer's willingness to buy durable goods was -70.2%, this represents a decrease of 64.5 pps relative to the average balance recorded during the second quarter of 2019 (Graph 3).

Cities. In June, the CCI increased in two of the five surveyed cities compared to May 2020.

The CCI increased compared to the previous month in Barranquilla (8,0 pps) and Cali (6,0 pps), and it decreased in Medellín (6,7 pps), Bogotá (2,6 pps) and Bucaramanga (2,5 pps).

Socioeconomic level. In June, consumer confidence increased in the low and middle strata compared to the previous month.

By socioeconomic level and compared to the previous month, the CCI increased 1.6 pps in the low strata and 0.7 pps in the middle strata; and it decreased 2.7 pps in the upper strata.

Housing. The willingness to buy a house increased 8.6 pps compared to last month. By cities, this indicator increased in four of the five analyzed cities relative to May 2020.

In June, the willingness to buy a house was -34.1%, 8.6 pps higher than the previous month. For this month, willingness to buy a house increased in Medellín (36,1 pps), Barranquilla (33,9 pps), Cali (15,0 pps) and Bucaramanga (3,9 pps), and it decreased in Bogotá (4,9 pps), compared to what was observed in May 2020.

Compared to the previous month, willingness to buy a house increased in the low and middle strata.

When analyzing by socioeconomic level in June, willingness to buy a house showed an increase compared to last month of 18.4 pps in the low strata and 0.7 pps in the middle strata, and a decrease of 19.8 pps in the upper strata, compared to what was observed in May 2020.

Durable goods. Willingness to buy furniture and home appliances increased 4.2 pps compared to the previous month. By cities, this indicator increased in three of the five analyzed cities compared to what was observed in May 2020.

The balance of answers about whether it is a good or bad time to buy goods such as furniture and appliances was -62.5% in June. This represents an increase of 4.2 pps compared to May 2020. Relative to last month, willingness to buy durable goods increased in Barranquilla (21,1 pps), Medellín (4,2 pps) and Bogotá (4,0 pps), and it decreased in Bucaramanga (6,8) and Cali (0,5 pps).

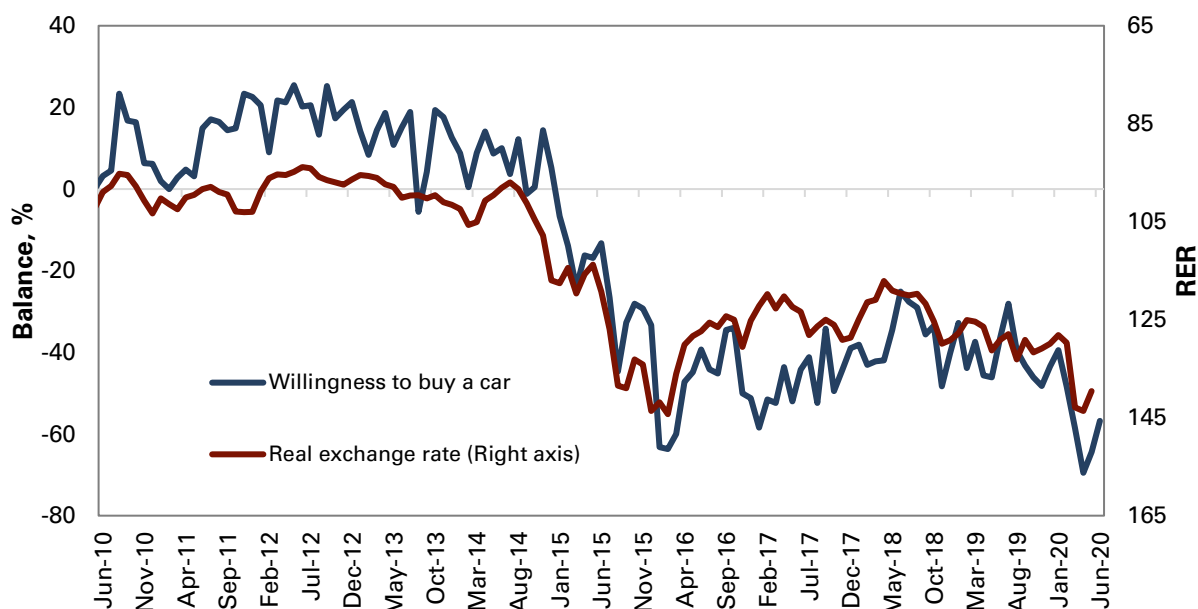

Vehicles. In June, the willingness to buy a vehicle registered a balance of -56.8%. This implies an increase of 7.6 pps compared to the previous month (-64.4).
